4. Non-resident Peregrine Capture Permit

Washington State allows the take of wild eyass and fledgling Peregrine Falcons from May 1 (date specified on the permit) through August 31 of the same year. One (1) non-resident PEREGRINE FALCON WILD-TAKE PERMIT will be issued per year to an out-of-state falconer. Only Master Falconers may apply for a PEREGRINE FALCON WILD-TAKE PERMIT. If the non-resident applies for this permit after the mid-April application deadline the permit will not be issued for that year. The non-resident PEREGRINE FALCON WILD-TAKE PERMIT is issued on a drawing basis taken at the mid-April application deadline.
