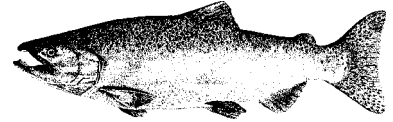

2. To be considered for a state record certificate, a game fish must be weighed on certified scales, legal for trade by the Weights and Measures Division of the Washington Department of Agriculture. Date of last inspection must be recorded. Certified scale can be found anywhere meat or produce is sold. Frozen fish will not be accepted for weighing.
3. It is the responsibility of the angler to contact a representative of the Department of Fish and Wildlife for positive identification and inspection of the fish. Such inspection may require extensive measurements and scale samples.
4. This application must be accompanied by a clear, unretouched photograph of the fish and angler who caught it, and preferably, with a second picture of a side view with the fish lying beside a yardstick. The photographs will not be returned unless specifically requested.
5. The angler must send the completed application to the Department of Fish and Wildlife's Olympia office within 30 days of the catch in order to be considered for a state record certificate. Additional information may be required for possible world record certification.
